

Introduction

This report provides the latest key information from Devon Home Choice and covers 1st April 2017 to 31st March 2018.

Households registered with Devon Home Choice

The total number of households in housing need (Bands A to D) fell during the 2017/18 financial year from 18,096 to 16,175, a reduction of 11%. This follows a similar reduction of 10% during 2016/17.

The reduction in numbers is the result of renewals being carried out by a number of local authorities. The reductions range from less than 1% in Mid Devon to 44% in Exeter. There were increases in numbers in 4 local authority areas ranging from 1% in West Devon to 18% in Plymouth.

The overall percentage of applications in Band E rose from 33% to 37%. This is because 2 areas which saw the largest reduction in numbers in Bands A to D, Torbay and Exeter, do not register Band E applicants so there was no corresponding reduction in the number in Band E.





Tables 5a, 5b and 5c below show the percentages on the register and percentages of homes let by the ethnicity of the main applicant for each LA area and Devon wide. The figures have been rounded to 2 decimal places for clarity, so some may appear not to add up correctly. A full breakdown of figures can be provided if requested. The percentage of homes let to non-white British households closely correlates to the proportions on the register in all areas with the greatest variance being 3.54% in Plymouth.



Bidding Patterns

Table 6 and Charts 4 & 5 below show the number of bids placed in each month since January 2017, and the number of households who have placed at least one bid in each month.

January 2018 saw the highest number of bids (28,134) and bidders (5,973) since we started recording these figures, although this will be largely due to the fact that 5 letting cycles commenced in January 2018. The only other month recorded in the table which had 5 full or partial letting cycles was August 2017 which had the second highest number of bids at 24,669 but only the 5th highest number of bidders. The trend lines in Charts 4 & 5 indicate a trend for increasing numbers of both bids and bidders.

To date 2,228 applicants have saved searches for property alerts on the system, this is up from 994 on 2nd January 2018.

Chart 4: Numbers of bids by month (including trend line)




Chart 5: Numbers of bidders by month (including trend line)






Table 7 below shows the proportion of applicants by local authority and Band who are considered to be inactive (e.g. they have not logged in or bid during the last 6 months and are not on autobid).

The proportion of inactive applicants has reduced since April 2017 across all bands other than Band E which has remained at 63%. The figures range from 27% in Teignbridge to 61% in Torridge. In Plymouth 60% of Band B applicants have not logged in or placed a bid in the last 6 months, compared to 18% of Band B applicants in Teignbridge.



Chart 6: Average number of bids for general needs homes






The average number of bids received for both 1 and 2 bedroom sheltered properties fell from the previous quarter but were in excess of the average figures (Table 10 below).

The proportion of general needs homes let to applicants in Band B during the year was 50% compared to a figure of 48% in 2016/17. The figures range from 29% in South Hams to 67% in Torbay.








Nearly 35,000 homes have now been let through Devon Home Choice since 2010. The total number of lets per year by bedroom size is shown in Table 15 and Chart 10 below. The total number of homes let during 2017/18(4,093) is lower than the yearly average of 4,347 and is the lowest total since 2012/13 (Chart 11).




